ATHENA Leadership Award: Carrie Gray received the ATHENA Leadership Award for her strong leadership in public service and her deep commitment to mentoring others, especially women. As County Administrator, she has guided major initiatives, overseen complex projects, and built trust through clear communication, integrity, and accountability. Beyond her county role, she has strengthened the region through board leadership, strategic partnerships, and advocacy for health and social services, making her a powerful example of leadership that lifts others and improves the community as a whole.

2026 Employer of the Year: Starr Insurance was named Employer of the Year for building a workplace culture centered on support, professional growth, and genuine care for employees. 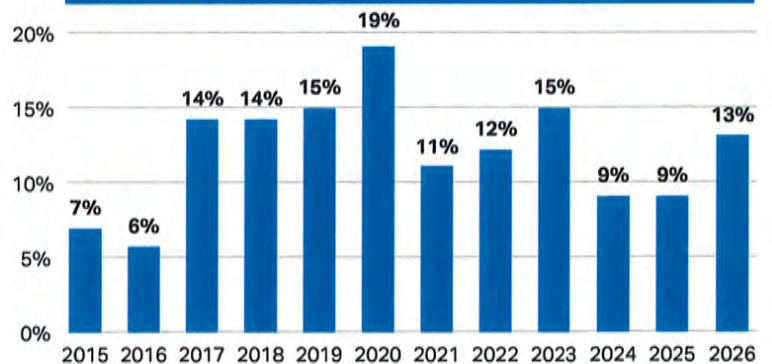

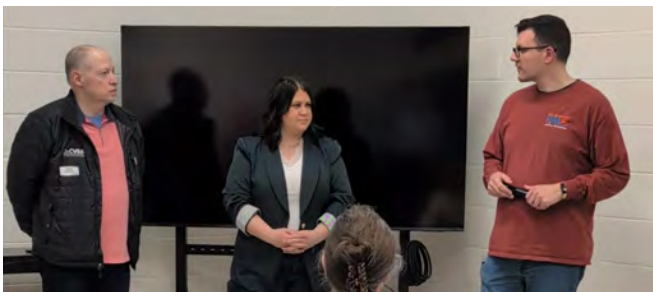
CVBA TRENDING NEWS
